Attendance at school

There has been a lot of information in the press about attendance of children at school post COVID. The DfE see this as an issue in terms of enabling all children to make progress at school. Our attendance is improving and we are grateful for your support. Going forward:

What we need from parents:

Telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence

Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival

Have a backup plan for if you have a problem getting your child to school: call on a family member, neighbour or friend

If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help

What we will do:

Check your child's attendance every day

Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you

Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.

If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may arrange a home visit
