Whilst attainment in Reading and Maths for PP has improved over the year, the gap with non PP children continues. Also, there is work to be done focusing on Writing (whole school challenge)

Children in receipt of PP are tracked and discussed with year groups at half termly Pupil Progress meetings. They are a focus for Phase Leaders monitoring to ensure that work is adapted and meets needs. Where issues are identified these are followed up robustly.

Attendance at teacher led clubs 2023-2024

Total number of children who attended at least one club for a half term was 161 out of 246 attendees across the year (as some attended more than one) – 42% (379 children on roll)

12 PP children attended at least one club

Attendance at music externally provided 2023-2024

Attendance at weekly peripatetic music sessions involved 35 children as 8 also attend orchestra. Of the 82 children who attended Rock Steady, 4 were PP. This totals 117 children who received music tuition last year.
